HOW TO APPLY:

To apply, please submit a **resume** and a short **cover letter** (one paragraph) stating why you are interested in the position.

- Attend monthly meetings to discuss progress, future steps, personal and group goals
- Contribute in strategic planning with the community and Massachusetts Legislature
- Network and connect with supporting organizations in Massachusetts
- Research the impact of conflict minerals in the Democratic Republic of Congo
- Stay updated on the conflict in Congo by reading and sharing news articles
- Compose bi-weekly update reports with personal advocacy efforts to promote awareness
- Complete various administrative tasks (updating contact information, maintaining email contact with organizations across the state, researching updates on legislation, etc.)
